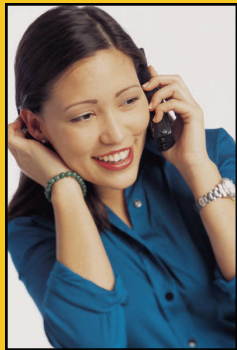

The **Recoveree Connection** program offers free telephone support to aid an individual in the recovery process from drug and alcohol addiction.

Volunteers will call recoverees to assist them in maintaining their sobriety. Volunteers will assist participants by providing peer support through telephone communication.
